

- Reintegration emphasizes guiding clients back into the community, and may involve anything from life skills (such as managing a budget and personal hygiene) to cognitive restructuring, anger management and addictions counselling
- Dedicated faculty guide students through practical, hands-on activities that include scenario-based role playing, case studies, and tours of existing facilities
- Students develop effective assessment and communication skills, and learn best practices to ensure personal safety, protection of the public, and the safety of staff, clients and the community
