

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Nursing offers many career directions, from making split-second decisions in the ER, to preventing illness through community health promotion. Expect to work evenings and weekends.

Nurses provide care for patients in all conditions, at all stages of life – from prenatal health to palliative care – in diverse settings:

- In hospitals, specializing in surgical and postsurgical care; medicine; emergency; intensive care; maternity; pediatrics; geriatrics; cardiovascular care; oncology (cancer); and psychiatry
- Providing ongoing care in rehabilitation centres, hospices, doctors' offices, long-term care facilities, and community agencies providing home care
- As educators in public health units, schools, poison control centres, workplace wellness programs, family planning and baby wellness clinics
- In research and progressive leadership positions in health and government agencies

Graduates are eligible to write the registration examination and, if successful, become registered members of the College of Nurses of Ontario. Registration in Ontario allows nurses to practise across Canada (except in Quebec) and in many states in the U.S. without further preparation.
