ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Required Academic Preparation

- OSSD/OSSGD or equivalent with courses at the general, advanced, (C), (U) or (M) level, and
- Grade 12 English (C) level or equivalent
- Mature applicant (see loyalistcollege.com)

Additional Considerations

- Physical demands of the program require sufficient eyesight to focus cameras in low light levels, and mobility sufficient to follow sports action and breaking news events from a variety of angles
- Students must be prepared for an above-average commitment of time and intensity; simultaneous part-time employment could prove difficult


Fast-Track Entry (PHJF)



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

- Photographers come from across Canada to hone their skills in telling a story with photographs, working exclusively with digital image capture
- Gain advanced photojournalism techniques in digital photography, video capture and computer-based image processing
- Photograph, report, write and edit assignments for our online news service, QNet News. Students contribute content throughout the year, building a strong portfolio of published work and transferable skills
- Assignments may involve optional travel to capture documentary picture stories
- Learn on-the-job with a 120-hour field placement with a magazine, newspaper, website, wire service, photo agency, or an editorial photographer. Students have interned at *The Canadian Press, The Toronto Sun, The Ottawa Citizen, The Ottawa Sun, The Calgary Herald, The Windsor Star, The Montreal Gazette, The Record, Reuters, Outpost Magazine* and Vue Picture Agency
