- •The first year provides a sound knowledge of the justice system and insight into Canada's current social and political structures, as well as human behaviour. Students develop essential career skills in ethical decision making and communications
- Second-year studies provide an in-depth understanding of enforcement procedures, risk management and threat risk assessments, private investigations, and emergency planning. Students develop effective investigative techniques including interviewing and statement taking, critical thinking and problem solving, and gathering evidence
- Graduates are equipped to conduct threat risk assessments and to audit an organization's security procedures; design a new security system; or recommend changes to existing procedures
- Placements offer the opportunity to graduate into a job. Recent placement experiences include Canadian Forces Military Police, City of Toronto Corporate Security, Darlington Nuclear Facility, Hydro One Corporate Security, CKR Global Private Investigations, Sears Retail Loss Prevention, Ottawa By-Law Enforcement, OC Transpo Special Constable, University of Toronto Special Constable, and Alcohol and Gaming Commission Enforcement Inspectors
