- You'll also receive instruction in writing for print and online media, and a grounding in the history, politics and sociology of sport
- · Put your skills into practice producing, interviewing, shooting, editing and hosting documentary-style sports programs for broadcast on 91X radio and for television
- Students may contribute game reports, profiles and feature sports stories for College television newscasts, in addition to sports reports for College radio
- · Coaching in on-air performance, and play-by-play reporting of live sports events, are integral components of the program
