

SECOND CAREER FUNDING



Second Career is an Ontario government program designed to provide laid-off, unemployed individuals with skills training for jobs in high-demand occupations in Ontario. Whether you wish to pursue a new career in business, science, health, media, skilled trades or another occupation, Second Career offers job training and financial support. It is a cost-sharing grant provided on the basis of individual need.

Participants have benefitted from a range of training, including one-year certificate programs and two-year diploma programs, with support for a maximum of two years. Depending on an individual's needs, Second Career funding often supports instructional costs such as tuition, books and transportation, and may also take into consideration costs such as a basic living allowance and dependant care.

WHY SHOULD YOU CONSIDER A SECOND CAREER PROGRAM?

Consider Second Career if further experience and certification could help you reach your personal and professional goals. A college education can help you to succeed in our fast-paced, technologically advanced world of work.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Anyone who has been laid off within the last five years is eligible to apply for Second Career, including those who have taken an interim job.

WHERE CAN YOU STUDY?

Training can be completed at colleges throughout Ontario. You can take your studies on campus, online, or through eLab at Loyalist College.

WHAT IS INVOLVED?

The first step is to connect with an Employment Ontario community partner such as Loyalist Community Employment Services, Career Edge or META Employment Services. They will provide more information and assess your eligibility.

You can meet with an advisor at Loyalist College before you meet with Employment Ontario or after being assessed. The College advisor will walk you through the process, including recognition for experience and prior learning, and provide a detailed plan of action or review your program choices.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS? IS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE?

You may incur additional costs such as books, travel and parking. The Ministry of Education assesses each student on an individual basis to determine which training costs will be covered based on individual need. Second Career students are encouraged to apply for OSAP. The staff at Loyalist's Financial Assistance office is happy to help you with the application process and teach you helpful budgeting skills.

WHICH PROGRAMS SHOULD YOU CONSIDER FOR YOUR SECOND CAREER?

At Loyalist, most certificate and diploma programs that can be completed within two academic years are eligible for Second Career funding. Loyalist offers 65 full-time programs in the following schools of study:

Applied Sciences, Skills and Technology Business and Management Studies Health, Human and Justice Studies Media, Arts and Design

Academic upgrading may be available at no cost. Programs that are not eligible for Second Career funding include post-graduate programs, General Arts and Science and Pre-Health Science.
